LANDFILL/REFUSE DISTRICT: John reported that someone left a broken sharps container with needles and syringes in front of the landfill gate.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: The seasonal Flu clinic has been changed from November 11th to September 26th due to the H1N1 vaccine will becoming available as early as October 1st. The H1N1 will be dispensed as directed by the CDC and MDPH. The agent is meeting weekly with the regional Flu committee for both seasonal and H1N1 planning. The EDS traffic planning for the regional sites is processing well and the committee will be reporting to the all Island Selectman on September 16th.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS: John reported that he verbally explained to Linda Benoit 32-90 that the Board would need detailed plans and a written description of what she is proposing for her change of use of her Single Family residence. In the past she has been granted a permit to rent up to three rooms in her home as a bed and breakfast with very limited (no PHF's) breakfast. She has not applied for any permit in 2009. Polaaastro 29-37 has no change in housing violation status, with the exception of the electric was put in his name rather than the tenant. The Housing violations for 29-30 Gough have been corrected and inspected. John gave an update on the Ag fair noting some chronic violations of temperature control and bare-hand contact for ready to eat foods.

BEACH TESTING: All Bathing beaches are within acceptable limits. Cocoa Cola Brook results were very high and John has talked to Park & Recreation supervisor, Joe Schroeder who will post the brook stating high levels of bacteria were found in the latest sapling results.
